



Mechanized Logging Operations Instructors

(Summer 2023)

Northern Maine Community College is seeking applicants for the anticipated opening of instructors for a Mechanized Logging Operations training program. The ideal candidates will have experience with various timber harvesting technology, including operating current harvesting equipment and routine diagnostic/maintenance tools.

These positions will assist in implementing an established training program at the College to produce professional equipment operators who will work in commercial mechanical forest operations. This 12-week program will be offered in the Old Town, Maine area during the summer of 2023.

Preferred qualifications include proficiency in logging equipment operations and experience in one or more of the following logging pieces of equipment: feller buncher, stroke delimeter, crane/slasher, forwarder, processor, center mount & mechanic. Candidates should be comfortable working with students and sharing their knowledge and experience with students. Duties will include one on one instruction in using logging equipment, maintenance, tree identification, silviculture plans, and trail layout.

This is a 14-week contract position. Pay range: \$21.00 to \$26.00 per hour, depending on experience. 60 hrs. a week on most weeks, overtime after 40 hrs. The expected start date is June 17th, end date is October 20th.
